Broadacre Primary School – Vision for PE

We believe in giving all pupils, irrespective of their academic or physical ability, the opportunity to discover and develop their physical potential through a balanced and developmental programme of activities. We do so in the belief that physical education in a safe, supportive and challenging environment is a vital component in the development of a child's physical and emotional health and well-being. This, we believe, includes qualities such as enjoyment, tolerance, co-operation and the development of expertise.

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is provided a funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013 – 2014, 2014 – 2015, 2015 – 2016 and 2016-2017 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This money is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see the money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of Funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible use of the funding includes:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE;
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE and sport;
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and or sport;
- Running sports competitions or increasing participation in school games;
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and or sport;
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.

For 2017 – 2018 the Government will provide additional funding which will see the amount delegated to each school double. The aim is to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport

- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- Run sport competitions
- Increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- Run sports activities with other schools
